Media Advisory: Launch of a Report on Karen Women Village Chiefs on International Women's Day

A new publication, 'Kill Me Instead of Them': A Report on the Resilience of Karen Women Village Chiefs, by the Karen Women's Organization (KWO) brings attention to the serious risks' women village chiefs in Karen State face, and the coping mechanisms they have adopted to mitigate conflict and ease tensions. Though men have traditionally held the position of a village chief, due to the high risk of being persecuted by the Burma Army, many fled for their lives. Seeing a need for leadership and an opportunity to bring peace, more women started to take on the position. The report, which will be launched on International Women's Day on 8 March, brings much needed visibility to the experiences of women village chiefs and in particular, the strategies they used, including quick thinking and negotiation to bring safety to their villages.

Despite ceasefire agreements between Karen armed groups and the Burma Army, fighting in civilian areas has continued to threaten the safety of local people. As conflict escalates, the stories of the threat's women faced and how they survived are increasingly more relevant. Further, this report is a testament to their narratives as protectors of their people against extraordinary odds.
